New year, new start

We at Inish Education Technology wish you all a very happy and successful New Year. We have great plans for the ongoing development of Causeway which we hope will provide you with an even better tool to create fabulous online learning content for your students.

If you have not used Causeway in a while, why not re-acquaint yourself with it? Your username will be your email and if you have forgotten your password, the login screen allows you to change your password securely. Below you will find a description of some of the new features to be found in the latest version.

Causeway 2.2

Hot on the heels of 2.1 we are now releasing Causeway 2.2. The new version will be implemented automatically for you. The navigation bar has a number of new features accessible through author settings. You will be able to collapse the navigation so that only chapters show. The constituent pages will only then show once your access a chapter. Also for neatness, you will be able to allow students toggle the navigation panel on and off and you will be able to hide content until the student has traversed preceding content.

We have made some changes to images so that you can now maximise these within the container and you can add captions above as well as below the image.

Finally we have created a new feature which will allow students to view a range of files (for example Word, PowerPoint and Pdf) from within Causeway (as well as being able to download them if wished).
